

Friendly Property Maintenance Reminders...

Grass, Weeds & Other Vegetation:

No person, owning or occupying any property within the Borough of Marysville, shall permit grass or weeds or any vegetation whatsoever, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon such premises to exceed a height of 6 inches.

Swimming Pools:

Any resident with an above ground (any size) or in ground swimming pool **must apply** for a Zoning Permit prior to installing the pool. Set backs must be met in order to have a pool. A pool cannot be closer than eight feet from your property lines and ten feet from a residence.

Electronics:

Waste Management is not allowed to pickup computer monitors and TVs. Please do not put these items curbside with your trash because they will NOT be picked up.

Unregistered/Unlicensed Vehicles:

No unregistered or unlicensed motor vehicle shall be permitted on private property in the Borough for a period in excess of 30 days unless it is enclosed in a permanent structure.

Police News

Residents are reminded *Street Sweeping* takes place every month on the 3rd Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:00 am - 5:00 pm. Please take notice to the posted signs to avoid parking tickets. If you receive a parking ticket, please pay it promptly. Failure to pay a \$15.00 parking ticket will result in a Traffic Citation being issued.

Warmer temperatures mean an increase in outdoor activity of children in the Borough. Parents, please help ensure your children's safety by making them wear helmets when riding bicycles and scooters. PA laws require all children under the age of 12 wear an approved helmet when



riding a bicycle or scooter. Parents are also reminded Marysville Borough has a Curfew Ordinance. Curfew for minors under age 14 years is 10 pm, for minors between age 14 and 18 years, curfew is 11 pm. Please be aware that anyone on a bicycle or scooter has the duties to obey stop signs and other traffic control devices as someone operating a motor vehicle.

Warmer weather also means an increase of motorcycles on Pennsylvania roadways. Please "Watch For Motorcycles". Friendly reminder: all drivers, it is illegal to text and drive in Pennsylvania. This includes texting while at red lights and stop signs. Distracted driving has become the #1 contributing factor of all Motor Vehicle Accidents in the United States. No text is worth dying for, or worse yet, killing someone.

Our local black bear activity has also increased with warmer temperatures. Wild birds do not need supplemental feeding during the warmer months when insects and seeds are readily available. These food sources along with outside food for dogs/cats is an attractant to bears. If you insist on having food sources outside, remove the food in the evening and place it back outside in the morning to help avoid human/bear conflicts.

Residents are reminded it is unlawful to let cats and dogs run at large. ALL cats and dogs <u>must be leashed</u> or under direct physical control at all times. Owners are also responsible for picking up and properly disposing of their pet's waste. For those using the Memorial Walking Path at the Marysville Lions Club, plastic bags and disposal containers are provided for pet waste.

Marysville Police Department has a Medication Drop Box located inside the Borough Office. Any unwanted or unused medication in pill or tablet form can be dropped in the drop box. No liquid medications can be accepted. No information is required from persons dropping off medication. The Borough office is open Monday-Friday from 7 am-3 pm. Two other drop boxes are also available for residents: Perry County Courthouse in New Bloomfield and Pennsylvania State Police Barracks in Newport.

Marysville PD is still offering a Special Needs Resident Registry Program for our residents. The program is for residents with any special needs to include, but not limited to, Dementia, Alzheimer's, Autism, physical limitations, and electricity dependent (example: oxygen machine). Residents with such needs can complete a Special Needs Resident Data Registration Form. The form includes a current photo, name, address, physical attributes, medical summary, emergency contacts, and other information important to aid officers and other first responders during an emergency situation. Emergency situations could include medical emergency, missing person/wandering, natural disaster, power outage or other critical incident. In order for the Marysville Borough Pool Swim Lesson Instructor to meet the needs of your child(ren), it is important that we all work together. By following the simple rules below, we can better ensure the safety and success of each child.

During the swim lessons, it is important that any interaction with your child is kept to a minimum. Your child will be taught by a Certified Swim Lesson Instructor and there will be a Certified Lifeguard to help assist with the lessons.

Seating is available under the pavilion or in the grass area. Please do not sit on the cement pool deck or on the benches located near the pool.

If you have any questions or concerns, please speak with the Swim Lesson Instructor or Pool Manager before or after the swim lessons.

Children should report to the pool five minutes before their scheduled time.

·No child may leave the pool area without permission.

·All children with long hair will be asked to secure their hair with a swim cap or pony-tail holder.

·Children are permitted to use goggles during the swim lesson but are not permitted to use nose clips or any type of flotation devices unless authorized by the instructor.

·Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.





According to Brian Hummel in his "A History of Rye Township," in 1819 Jacob Sidle sold a parcel of land for \$1 to Christian Ensminger, William Messinger, Peter Foulk, Conrad Sloop, Peter Gamber, George Albright, Conrad Yohe, Philip Hench, George Shade, Daniel Yohe David Shade, Solomon Fenicle and David Myers for the purpose of building a school building east of Grier's

Pole Raising at Grier's Point.

Last Saturday was a gala day for the citizens of Rye township. For weeks past preparations have been in progress for the erection of a monster flag pole at Grier's Point, and on Saturday afternoon the pole was raised in the presence of a large as-semblage, with appropriate cere-monies, amid shouts of patriotic ap-

The pole was planted in front of the schoolhouse at Grier's Point. It is 108 feet high and is the tallest pole in Perry, or any of the surrounding counties. It is set eight feet in the ground and is all one piece, with the exception of about thirty feet at the base, which is of locust. pole is painted red, white and blue and is surmounted with a ball, spear and fish. From its top floats a beautiful flag, 12 by 20 feet in size.

The exercises incident to the pole raising were held in the Evangelical church at Grier's Point. The church was handsomely decorated with flags and evergreens, and a large evergreen arch spanned the auditorium in front of the pulpit. The speakers for the occasion were J. M. Barnett, Esq., and James M. McKee, Esq , of this place, who both delivered eloquent and patriotic addresses. The exercises were interspersed with music by the church choir and school chil dren. Ex County Commissioner D. P. Lightner acted as master of ceremonies. The pole raising was an in-teresting event and the people of Rye township are justly proud of their achievement.

In 1835 a school house was built near the John Secrist farm and was used until 1872 when it was replaced. In 1895, the school yard was expanded by purchasing land from the neighboring farmer, George Fenicle. A large wooden flag was erected in 1899 (see news article, The Perry County Democrat (Bloomfield PA Wed. March 15, 1899) and was removed in the mid 1920's. The building currently is used as a social hall for the Grier's Point United Methodist Church. Please mark your calendars for October 13th for the Marysville Rye Historical Society Annual Dinner. Our guest speaker

will be Linda Gilmore presenting on her book "Celebrating 200 Years of Perry County History." Her presentation will cover the iron and wooden Rockville bridges that carried the train traffic before the stone-arched bridge was built. Current MRHS members will receive a discount on the cost of the dinner.
