New Business

Rockville Bridge Drop

Kim said she met with Heather Gutshall, Scott Lenker, Ken Little, Wayne Morcom of Pack 56/Troop 56 and William Gumbinger of the Marysville Moose Lodge regarding the Rockville Bridge Drop. Both organizations are interested in having the event. The following items were discussed:

- Pack/Troop 56 would like to build a new Rockville Bridge for the drop. One that will be lighter.
- The Rockville Bridge will be dropped from the Moose Lodge roof by a pully system.
- Bleachers, chairs and canopy can be setup in square. This would eliminate people crossing the street at the subway.
- Have the post No Parking signs in the square and close the square at Union Street/Valley Street and Front Street/Verbeke Street.
- Have the borough put signs at the bottom of the subway to let people know to be cautious with the event ahead.
- Ask the Marysville Fire Company to have fire police and rescue truck for lighting,
- The Marysville Moose will provide a DJ for music and open the ballroom and restrooms.
- Bonfire
- Ice Sculptures
- Have organizations/vendors attend to sell food items or have demonstration/information tables.

The people listed above are going to meet at the Marysville Moose on Monday, July 20, 2020 at 6:00pm to discuss further and to come up with a plan to present to the Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting on August 3, 2020.

The other thing is it looks like the event sponsor will have to be the Moose since it is licensed. But, the Foundation can supply help etc. and the Moose can donate some proceeds to the Foundation.
- William said he can apply for the special event permit. The cost is \$25.00.
