The Streets Committee Meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm on Monday, March 2, 2020 at the Marysville Borough Office. Present were Council members Steve Copp Dave Magee and Lance Barthel. Also present were , Borough Manager Zachary Border, Borough Engineer Greg Rogalski and Maintenance Worker Robert Laman and Ken Miller

Long Term Planning:

Streets (Lincoln from Front to Cameron, South Main from Mill Ave south to Bed & Breakfast, Front Street from 508 to Greenbriar, Maple Ave 700 block, Adams Avenue Valley to Cameron

Trucks/Equipment:

Skid Loader Replacement in 2022
2014 Dump Rechassic Replacement in 2021
Plow Truck configuration 2021.

New Business

1. Road Salt Inventory Update
Manger Border updated the committee that this year the borough used 93 tons out of the 300 that was ordered.
2. Safety Manual
The workers compensation company that the borough uses is requiring a new safety manual. A draft was presented to the committee to look over. This will be placed back on the committee agenda for April's meeting for further discussion.
3. Inventory
Manger Border updated the committee on how each department was tasked with creating an inventory system to better keep track of supplies.
4. Perry County Grant Program
Mr. Magee gave an update about a new grant writer that was hired by Perry County to help find and write grants for organizations in the county.
5. Contracted Services for Plowing Areas not Owned by the Borough
Solicitor Altman wrote an email to the committee asking why certain private properties were being plowed while others were not. The Committee decided that each property of concerned should continue to be plowed and a contract should be made with each property owner.

6. Land Survey Behind the Borough Building

This item was removed from the agenda.

7. Three Hour Parking Limit Sign

A business owner had a concern about there not being enough parking in public parking lot for her customers. She stated residents were parking in the lot for most of the day and night. She wanted to know if a three hour parking sign could be put back in the lot. The Committee discussed and it was decided there was no good way to enforce the time limit.

Old Business

1. Road Project – Jay Fulkroad and Sons

A certified letter was sent to Jay Fulkroad and Sons letting them know the their work needed to be complete between April 1 and May 1.

2. Suez - Paving of streets (Linden Ave & Maple Ave)

Suez is on track for spring paving

3. Bridge Inspection South Main over Fishing Creek

Information was given to the committee about a new HATs/Tricounty grant funding program. This grant could help pay for repairs for the bridge.

4. Pole Building

There was concern from the maintenance and sewer departments about the location of the building. A new location was suggested that may help to solve the problem.

5. Street Closure Request from Historical Society

The committee recommended that this be sent to council for approval

6. Liquid Fuels Account Update

A meeting will be held with Penndot and borough staff on April 1st

7. Water Run Off onto Mr. Stevens Property

This was removed from the agenda.
