

**Marysville Borough
Streets Committee Minutes
October 5, 2020
1:30PM**

The Streets Committee Meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm on Monday October 5, 2020 at the Marysville Borough Office. Present were Council members Dave Magee and Steve Copp also present were, Borough Manager Zachary Border, and Borough Engineer Greg Rogalski and maintenance workers Ken Miller and Rob Laman.

Long Term Planning:

1. Pole Building

The Committee asked questions about a lean-to being built to cover the equipment that is left out in the weather. Ken did not know if there was enough room, but did suggest they may be able to extend the current garage in depth which would allow two vehicles to be parked back to back.

Trucks/Equipment:

The plow configuration and Skid loader will both be added to the 2021 budget for consideration by council.

New Business

1. **Plan for snow plowing**

With Lonnie leaving the maintenance staff was worried about having adequate coverage for snow plowing. There was discussion about reaching out to companies to find out if they be willing to be on call for snow events.

2. **Above ground Gas and Diesel tank**

The committee was okay going with Eshenaur for diesel and having them place the tank at the plant. They were a little more concerned with the gasoline as it is more explosive. The Committee wanted me to reach out to Eshenaur to see if they would be willing to give us a key to fuel up at there on site pump.

3. **Mowing the Memorial**

Dave was concerned about running the zero-turn mower over the memorial bricks and causing damage. After discussion it was decided that Ken would no longer run the mower over the bricks.

4. Selling the 1997 International

The committee agreed to sell the 1997 international on Municibid. They want to get a list of other items that the borough could sell. Ken is going to get a list to Zach. This will be placed on the council agenda.

Old Business

1. South Main Street Bridge Project

Greg updated the borough; he said the borough should put aside 150,000 dollars for the 2021 budget for design work on the new bridge. This would then be considered the match that the borough needs to supply of the grant that was awarded by Tri-County Regional Planning.
