Streets Sewer and Sanitation Meeting Minutes October 3, 2022 2:15 PM

The Streets, Sewer and Sanitation Committee meeting was called to order at 2:15 PM on Monday, October 3, 2022, at the Marysville Borough Office. Present were Committee Member John Edkin and Jackie Zulli, Committee Chair. Also, present were Sewer Operators Lonnie Sarver and Pete Boele; Maintenance Worker Rob Laman and Borough Manager, Zachary Border.

New Business

1. Sidewalks

Robert Long 601 Linden Ave attended the meeting to discuss sidewalks and how he feels they should be put in on Linden Ave because of safety concerns such as people in wheelchairs being pushed up the street as well as strollers. He presented a petition of about 60 people who also shared the same concern. Chairwomen Zulli discussed an email that was received from the Borough Solicitor stating that properties can not be singled out and that if one property owner was going to be made to put in a sidewalk then all property owners would need to do the same. Council would not be able to force an owner to put in sidewalks.

2. Line Painting on Verbeke Street

The Committee received a letter from John Fasnacht, 21 North Main Street about turning Verbeke Street into a one-way in front of the Marysville Moose and repainting the yellow line in front of the Marysville Moose. The committee decided to not move on making the street one way, but did want the highway crew to repaint the line.

3. Trash Contract

Manager Border presented the committee with the current contract that expires on August of 2023. The committee suggested they come up with a list of things that are wanted in the next contract. This way the borough can start to develop a RFP with the hopes of having a new contract in place by June of 2023. The committee will come back at the next meeting with suggestions.

4. Picture Perry

The committee looked at all three projects and decided that they were okay the way they were to be added to the County Comp Plan.

Old Business

1. Address Change Kings Highway

Manager Border stated that he spoke with the post office and the county about changing the address of 101a to 107a and that he was just waiting to hear back from the county.

2. Cameras for the Wastewater Treatment Plant

John Edkin was going to put Zach in contact with someone he knows to walk the plant and give suggestions on where cameras could be located. Zach will come back to the next meeting with updated numbers.
